



From Pastor Bill

"In 2024, we will begin a process of long-term planning, particularly in relationship to our building and our staffing."

This is our first goal for 2024. It came out of an awareness that our future will require us thinking about how we staff the church and about how we care for the large facility that is ours.

Shar Bourdon, our music director, has recently communicated to us that she wants to have fewer responsibilities in her job. She is not retiring but would like to have someone else manage our music ministry with children. She would also prefer to have someone aid her with music planning. Therefore, right now we are rewriting job descriptions so that her wishes can be fulfilled. She has been such a gift to our community, and we do not want to lose her as the director of our ensembles. The future may bring some changes in our music leadership.

I don't plan to retire anytime soon, but retirement is certainly on my radar screen. I suspect as we complete this year and then enter 2025, it will be worth our while to reflect on what we may need to do to prepare for my eventual departure. Again, my retirement is not imminent, but it is likely to come within the next three years. Our council wants to be proactive in light of this eventuality. And part of that proactivity includes a message like this.

Our desire to think long term in relationship to our building is really quite practical. Our facility is large and is aging. We want to make sure that we in a measured way address some of our building needs. So, we are getting quotes for a wide range of building needs. The parsonage is going to need a new roof at some point. Our church building will require new carpet soon. If we can take care of some of these needs early and one-by-one, we won't be overwhelmed by an onslaught of building expenses that we might face at a single point in our life together.

Life is very good at First Lutheran. We are blessed with good staff and a great facility. The passage of time brings changes to both. I trust that the Spirit will move us faithfully and courageously into the future that I am convinced will be a future of life and hope.

Geography is on my mind these days. A simple definition of the word is the study of places and the relationships between people and their environments. Geographers explore both the physical properties of Earth's surface and the human societies spread across it. I distinctly remember geography was a course offering when I attended school. The topic of geography in schools today is often folded into one of the other disciplines making up social studies — civics/government, history or economics. As of 2020, there are only six states that require students to take a stand-alone geography class to graduate. I'm not advocating one way or another at what is the best way to study geography, stand-alone or integrated into a larger curriculum, but I do believe that geography is important when it comes to discussing our diversity and identity.

You may be wondering why this topic is ruminating in my mind these days and here's why. I was traveling to Saginaw to visit my cousin and while driving through the rural areas I couldn't help but think that where we live is a big part of our identity. The farm houses standing alone on several acres of land, the tiny towns with a few storefronts spanning a city block and strangely enough, a Dollar Tree in the middle of nowhere. I was curious about how often people shopped for food or where they socialized. And it was this curiosity that prompted me to think about how land shapes us and our ideals, our personal philosophy in race, religion and the political arena.

I also entertained the idea of how we stereotype people according to where they live. And I wonder if this impacts how we view those from other countries whose lands look nothing like our own and whose habits are drastically different from ours. And yet, one of the large farm houses I passed had a makeshift polling station in the front yard. You could stop and sign petitions and listen to the owner's political stance on all the hot-button topics of the day. Yes, I made a u-turn on the narrow shoulder and stopped to check it out. I didn't stay long and I didn't sign anything, but I did find the owner's viewpoints on life to be interesting.

And as I neared my destination, I couldn't help but think of the people of Gaza and what geography is left that provides them with a sense of place, an identity. Or what immigrants must feel when all they have known and what has shaped their identity thus far is gone. Or when kids move to college and the landscape and people look dramatically different than the little hometown where they had spent most of their life. And I couldn't help but think what the world would look like if we viewed people and their geographical landscapes as part of the big story of creation.

A common greeting in Zulu is *Sawubona*. It can be translated as 'I see you; you are valued by me, and I acknowledge your full humanity'. The traditional response is *Shiboka* which means 'I exist for you'. I believe that the root of so much conflict and disagreement is our inability, or our refusal, to genuinely see and take note of the full humanity of another person, regardless of where they live. Perhaps this Zulu greeting and response enables people to see the full humanity of the individuals acknowledged in all their virtues and their flaws. (And all my virtues and flaws, too!)

Summer is often a time of travel and exploring new places and meeting new people is an exciting part of the experience. I would encourage you to see the 'other' through the lens of belonging under the umbrella of creation, because, you see, we all belong in the kingdom of God. Whether we live

Hand Bells

Music reading is a complex endeavor. Reading/singing/playing a single line of music requires a vast number of brain functions to decode the notes/tones, duration/rhythm, gross and fine motor skills and much more. When you ring hand bells or chimes, you are focused on a much more attainable skill set. Ringing puts you into a team situation where you act as one finger on a pair of hands performing on a keyboard instrument. We are a TEAM that individually focuses on **beat** and **rhythm**.

I would like you to consider joining our Hand Bell choir at First Lutheran! I will provide a beginning level introduction that will focus on ringing techniques and rhythm-reading fundamentals. I am open to suggestions about when to teach this class, so look for the sign-up sheet on the music room door and suggest one. This opportunity is for all ages from 7 to 77. One of my current ringers recently told me that hand bells was her way of being able to participate in the music of church even though she didn't fancy herself a singer. Maybe you share that feeling. The final thing to consider is this. Stewardship in church is not ONLY about money. This is a wonderful way to increase your 'giving' to the church. I hope to see you soon.
