From Pastor Bill

"Aware of the grief, violence, and deep pain of our world, we will in 2024 and beyond endeavor to be a community of lament, love, and reconciliation, focusing on calling our members into deeper connections with one another and with the ministry of the church."

This is our second congregational goal for this year. It came because of our awareness of the tough world that we are living in right now. Yes, every era has had difficult moments. But this moment seems particularly troublesome to many of us. The injustices experienced by the folks in Gaza, Israel, and Ukraine are very difficult to wrap our minds around. While the fundamental Christian claim is that God is good, God's goodness seems far away sometimes. And this for many is one of those sometimes.

We do well not to run from the difficulties, the challenges, and the wonderings of life; we do well to tell the truth. As I look at American history, I see a country that sometimes doesn't want to face the truth. We often have short memories—memories that protect us from the mistakes we made, the hardships we have experienced. That doesn't serve us. Naming the pain is necessary for doing something about it, which is why we want to be a community of lament.

I hope you have noticed our highlighting lament during Lent. We heard the laments of individuals, and we prayed corporate laments. Lament is a necessary, and as we have discovered, a Biblically sanctioned part of faith. We want to be a community in which lament is not only welcomed but is encouraged.

Part of the challenge of doing life right now is not only the injustices around us, but the miserable state of the politics of our land. We are living in such a polarized time. We at First want to be a community in which our oneness in Christ transcends our political differences. I personally believe that Jesus is neither a Republican or a Democrat, a conservative or progressive. Now don't get me wrong. I think what Jesus was up to has great political consequences. Those who follow Jesus will advocate for the poor, the earth, immigrants, and the vulnerable. Those who follow Jesus will fight injustice and speak loudly for peace. You can't follow Jesus and do otherwise.

And you can't follow Jesus and not desire to bring people together. There are folks in our national (Continued on page 3)

We at First don't want to be the kind of community that foments division, that tears down those who disagree with us, that fails to see the human dignity of every person. We truly want to be a community of Christ.




John Ball Zoo Trip
