### **From Pastor Bill**

As many of you already know, our congregation has been blessed by the estate of Dorothy Wilson with a home that we have chosen to sell to Gary Hansen, our former pastor and bishop. The sale of the house will net us more than \$260,000. And much to my surprise, that is not the only money that we will be receiving from her estate. Dorothy has named us a beneficiary of two of her financial accounts. At this point, I am not sure how much money that will represent, but it will be a generous contribution to our mission and ministry.

Our church council will determine how the money will be used. What I know for sure is that at least fifty percent of the gift will be dedicated to debt reduction. We currently owe more than \$430,000 to Thrivent Financial for the addition we built in 2003. I am feeling confident that we will be able to eliminate a significant portion of that debt, which is such good news for us. I could see us being debt free within one and a half to two years.

Ten percent of the gift will likely be given away to ministries outside of our own. We think it is important to give away a portion of what is given to us, an approach that obviously has Biblical warrant.

What will happen with the rest of the money will likely include a gift given to the general fund, one to our Endowment fund, and then one to a contingency/project fund that will aid us in completing some projects in the building that need to be finished. The council will prioritize these projects.

I know of some congregations that have been damaged by large financial gifts. I am strongly committed to ours not being one of these. We in leadership will be transparent with how money is spent and where it is placed. We will remain the very faithful stewards that we have been throughout the years.

This gift does not mean that we don't still need your gifts. We do. Since a significant portion of the gift will be used to eliminate debt (more than \$7100 per month), all kinds of expenses at the church will remain. Eliminating debt, though, will be such a blessing. It will free up money that can be used for other purposes, including some that could aid the way we staff our congregation.

What a gift we have been given! Join me in thanking Dorothy for her generosity and in making sure that money is a blessing to our common ministry and not a burden.





### From Pastoral Assistant Paula

Many of you know I love a good story. I like to tell stories, too. In my reflection this month, I would like to talk about a particular story about borders and belonging. A story about a particular time, a particular people and a particular type of leadership, judges. Judges who were not monarchs, nor were elected, nor were they hereditary. Judges who had a clear mandate: to highlight injustice, to highlight hypocrisy and call the people back to the God they followed. Judges who were less legislative arbiters and more leaders. Judges who judged.

It's a story placed in a time of famine. The Hebrew interpretation of the word famine is, *indicating hunger*. Famine is also a familiar storyline in the Hebrew Bible from Abram to Joseph to David and it's often narrated with the experience of displacement and death. *This* story is no exception. *This* story is being told with a mythic quality of story telling often used in national narratives. *This* story sees events of a particular time as a window through which the state of a people can be viewed.

This story opens up the window of leadership, of famine and the window of a displaced woman, from a hated country. And with these windows flung open, the story of Ruth... flows in. Ruth the Moabite. Ruth the widowed border-crosser. Ruth, a foreigner on land not her own. Ruth, a character of virtue whose national belonging was viewed before her personhood. Ruth, a woman whose identity is shaped by her country of origin. Or is it? Ruth, a simple story to trouble the simple stories we sometimes tell about borders and belonging. Or is it? Is it a story about addressing stereotypes? Is it a story that invites us to something much more challenging, complex and ultimately healing, for us and the world? Or is it a Where-You-Go-I-Will-Go story and we leave it at that?

Yes, I like a good story and I assume you do, too. So I invite you today into the story of Ruth. A narrative where we can wrestle with early Jewish interpretation or commentary on a Biblical text and ask good questions. Questions that help us better understand the plight of the immigrant and widow, experience grief from a new perspective and ponder how location shapes other's opinions of us or... opens us up to an identity crisis of our own. I invite you into the storytelling lens of 'Midrash' as you engage with the story of Ruth. Read it. Question it. Sink your teeth into it. Chat with a friend or small group about what the narrative may or may not be saying. Think about how the short story of Ruth might speak to a quality and practice of belonging in the here and now.
