### From Pastor Bill

There are churches in our community that describe themselves as "vertical churches." By that, I think they mean that they are churches that emphasize the vertical relationship between God and us humans.

I appreciate that, because our personal and corporate relationships with God matter deeply. We as Lutheran Christians want to nurture those relationships, thinking that that these relationships are foundational.

But we don't think that the relationship with God can be spoken of without mentioning the horizontal relationships between people. The author of First John puts it this way: "Those who say, 'I love God,' and hate a brother or a sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they cannot see. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also."

To love God is to love people. To be in a relationship with God is to be in a relationship with people. Vertical and horizontal belong together. For me, you cannot have one without the other.

I realize that if the church says that it is a vertical church it is much easier to define the church's mission. If the focus is on connecting God and people, you won't have to deal with realities that seem tangential to the life of the church. If it is all about people's relationship to God, then what you use your building for, for example, is clearly defined. It won't need to be open for the sake of the horizontal dimension: the bike trail commission, people who play pickleball, the Lion's Club, bunco and basketball players, traveling cyclists. They won't be thought of as a necessary part of the church's mission.

But for those of us who bring verticality and horizontality together, they are an integral part of our mission. We can't do church without our connection to the community. And the community involves people of all kinds, groups of all kinds. For us to love is to open our doors to the horizontal. Now I know that this makes our life together more difficult, certainly messier. But it's in the complexity and disorder of life that we are called to live out who we are. And it's there, also, that we are discovered by the God who meets us at a cross, the ultimate symbol of the messiness of life and the ultimate coming together of the horizonal and the vertical.





### From Pastoral Assistant Paula

Happy Thanksgiving! November is the month set aside to celebrate the harvest and give thanks for all the blessings we have received throughout the year. And while I think setting aside a day to offer thanks is good, I'm a firm believer in the *twelve-month-plan* where gratitude and thanksgiving are a part of our DNA. But truthfully, it's not easy to be grateful while living in a time when so many things in our country and in the world are in disarray. Armed ICE officers are strolling the streets in many cities in the US - looking for someone who fits a particular profile. Housing costs have risen, children are hungry and equitable healthcare seems a distant dream.

But... I am extremely grateful for the ceasefire and end to the war in Gaza. I am extremely grateful for the return of the Israeli hostages and the Palestinian prisoners who have been held on administrative charges for months and years. Yes, it's a time to celebrate with people who have been victims of injustice and now live life outside of bondage. But...I am extremely pained for those who are left behind in the fray of injustice.

I believe one of the hardest things to do as Christians is hold both suffering and celebration together. And if you know me well, I want life to fit a more orderly pattern. Embrace the suffering, see new life emerge and celebrate! Sometimes life does work out that way but more often than not, someone we love is suffering. People we know - or don't know - are living in war zones, starving, and filled with fear. People are in recovery from addiction, a new baby is born, and a broken heart is healed.

So what does the *twelve-month-gratitude-plan* look like? We give thanks, daily. We work toward peace and justice, daily. We lament with the suffering, daily. It's hard work and it's joyful celebration all wrapped up in one! Won't you join me in thanksgiving and prayer this month as we yearn for change, justice, liberation, wholeness AND sing praise for the harvest of abundance? Frederick Buechner stated, "The place God calls you (us) to is the place where your (our) deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet."

I think this is the true nature of thanksgiving and what the twelve-month-gratitude-plan looks like.
