# From Pastor Bill

I must admit that what is happening in the Ukraine is deeply piercing my soul. The pain being imposed on the people there is beyond imagination. How much more can they withstand? How much more suffering can the world endure? The scourge of Covid is starting to wane, and now we face this humanitarian crisis.

If you think evil is not real, you aren't paying attention. I believe that we need to name evil when it is apparent. And Vladimir Putin is an evil man who seems to have no regard for human life and dignity. Today we are told that at his behest a hospital full of pregnant women was attacked. This is pure, unadulterated evil.

You and I are about to enter the climax of our big narrative. We are moving closer to Good Friday and Easter. The message of Good Friday is, without a doubt, multi-faceted. One significant piece of the diamond that Good Friday is comes to us from the Gospel of John. This gospel depicts the cross as judgment—judgment of what the world does to love. The cross is lifted up so that we can see what we and especially the powers of this world do when love threatens our little lives. The cross is like a mirror to the world. And what it reveals is not pretty. Sometimes we don't like to look in the mirror. But we must. We must face the truth. Evil is real. And it can be seen in people like Putin and even in us.

Glancing at the cross is tough. It's necessary if life is going to change. Putin won't change until he tells the truth about his narcissistic self. We won't change if we don't tell the truth about ourselves.

The Gospel of John would have us focus our attention on the cross, though, not simply so we can face our sin, but so that we can encounter the deepest truth of life, which is the love that God has for the world. In the cross we see not only evil, but love.

"God so loved the world that he gave his only Son," John tells us. There is no greater love than the one we meet in the self-sacrifice of Jesus experienced on the cross.

I pray daily that the love of God experienced in the cross of Christ might get to Putin's heart. I don't know. His narcissism might be so potent that that is a pipedream. I hope not.





# From Pastoral Assistant Paula

Throughout this Lenten season I have been reading a book entitled, *A Way Other than Our Own*. The book is a collection of devotions written by Walter Bruggemann specifically for the Lenten season. I am sharing an entry from the book in hopes that together we can enter the fifth week of Lent *unafraid* of the alternative world that names us, shapes us, and calls us to the foot of the cross.

#### Known, Named, and Unafraid

But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. Isaiah 43:1

Being unafraid is an odd vocation; but it is the vocation of all those who have been baptized. We are different when baptized. The Acts account of the early church says that the Spirit of God came upon the ones baptized, even as the Spirit came upon Jesus in baptism. A lot of silliness is taught about the spirit coming in baptism. But what the Spirit does is visit our lives our persons, our bodies, our imagination, our money - with the freedom of God, so that we are unafraid in the world, able to live differently, not needing to control, not needing to dominate, not needing to accumulate, not driven by anxiety. The book of Acts is the study of the baptized, the ones the Spirit visits, the ones who are unafraid in the world. It says of that community of known, named, and unafraid people, "They turned the world upside down" (Acts 17:6). Or better to say, they turned the world right side up.

The truth is that frightened people will never turn the world, because they use too much energy on protection of self. It is the vocation of the baptized, the known and named and unafraid, to make the world whole:

- *The unafraid* are open to the neighbor, while the frightened are defending themselves from the neighbor
- *The unafraid* are generous in the community, while the frightened, in their anxiety, must keep and store and accumulate, to make themselves safe.
- *The unafraid* commit acts of compassion and mercy, while the frightened do not notice those in need.
- *The unafraid* are committed to justice for the weak and the poor, while the frightened see them only as threats.
- *The unafraid* pray in the morning, care through the day, and rejoice at night in thanks and praise, while the frightened are endlessly restless and dissatisfied.

#### Let us pray...

In a world of fear and anxiety, you empower us to live lives of wholeness, lives that make the world whole and turn it right side up. Embolden us as those who know that they are called by your name. Amen.


