## From Pastor Bill

As I write this, I am and we are preparing for the birth of Jesus, the one we call “the Prince of Peace.” The book of Micah in the first reading for the last Sunday of Advent dreams of a leader who shall be “one of peace.” Luke’s Christmas story has the angels sing: “Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth *peace* among those whom he favors.”

Peace is no incidental aspect of the Christian life. It is not an insignificant component of the ministry of Jesus. “Blessed are the peacemakers,” Jesus says in Matthew, “for they will be called children of God.” The reality and calling of peace are integral to the discipleship of Jesus.

I write such a thing at the end of a year during which our nation’s Capitol was badly damaged and people were killed by insurrectionists, rioters ransacked and destroyed a multitude of buildings throughout the country, several protestors were killed or injured by a seventeen-year-old carrying a massive weapon, and young people from Michigan were gunned down in a school by a fifteen-year-old male. This is not a land of peace. It is a country shaken and shaped by violence.

So, I wonder, what is the role of our congregation in such a time? Do we have a role to play to bear

witness not to power, destruction, and violence, but to love, compassion, and, yes, to peace? Can we commit ourselves to the way of peace, as an alternative to the way of violence that so characterizes our culture?

This is what I hope we will think about as we move into the New Year. To be a Christian is not just a matter of believing certain things; it’s about doing certain things. It’s about representing ways of living that build people up, express kindness, search for justice, and value peaceful resolution of conflict.

The issues are massive: violence in media and video games, our obsession with guns, particularly of mass destruction, public name calling, a general disrespect for people and property, family disintegration, absentee fathers, social media libertinism, rejection of difference, suspicion of authority and expertise, divisive politics, despair and anger among the young. Addressing all these issues is way beyond what is possible for a community of faith like ours. But we can do a lot to model what it means to be disciples of Jesus who are committed to peace and to bringing people together, not tearing them apart.

I am not comfortable in thinking there is nothing we can do to stop the kinds of mass shootings that the city of Oxford, Michigan just experienced. Kids should not be forced to live with constant fear while they are at school. Together we need to do something. Join me in making 2022 a year of peace. We need to make a difference...a big difference.

By the time you receive this newsletter, we will have ushered in a new year. The gifts will have been gifted; holiday greetings exchanged; and the peaceful sound of Silent Night is but a distant memory. And I don't know about you, but I enter this new year with a bit of wonderment, expectation and...uncertainty. What will the new year bring? I wonder and wait with great expectation that Covid will no longer dictate our daily activities and shape our gatherings. I wonder if hospital staff will experience a reprieve from exhaustion and unnecessary death. I wonder if the people we elected to govern will put aside partisan politics, pride and misplaced power in order to care for the common good. I wonder... if this will be the year that law enforcement will no longer have to police the hallways and grounds of schools and children will no longer watch a classmate die at the hands of another.

I wait, wonder and yes, experience uncertainty as we begin the new year. And while I wonder, I glance backward and take another look at the magnificent hope of Christmas - of God's redeeming love. A love that came in the midst of a people who were living in angst and who were experiencing atrocities, injustice,

hunger and war. A love that came in the midst of nations who were filled with great anticipation and with great despair. A love that came in the midst of a people waiting and wondering when the promised *King - the Messiah*, would come and restore peace, usher in justice and relieve them of their waiting. And then... the hope of God was born.

The hope of God came, not as the result of powerful leadership, rigid laws or pomp and circumstance, but through ordinary people. Ordinary people who were fundamentally different but drawn together into the company and embrace of the other. Ordinary people drawn together right smack-dab in the midst of a world that was on edge. A young, pregnant teenager, an uncertain bridegroom caught off guard, a distant relative, smelly shepherds, a bleary-eyed inn owner and royalty - all gathered together to be a part of the bigger story of God's grace, mercy and hope. The magnificent hope that ushers in the new year.

Let us embrace this hope as we move through some dreary winter days; let us be drawn *together* into the bigger story of Jesus' birth. Let us not lose sight of the magnificent hope that came to ordinary people in the midst of difficult circumstances, difficult days and uncertainty. Walter Brueggemann writes, "Let us make new resolves, run fresh risks and embrace new lives." And let us begin the new year with wonderment, expectation and yes, uncertainty.

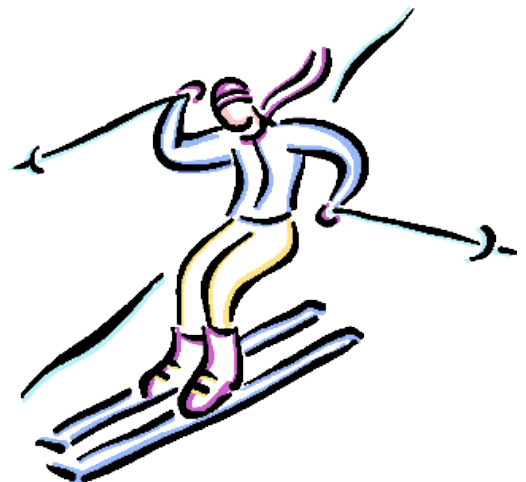
