# From Pastor Bill

#### Dear Friends:

We are now ready to announce that First will begin hosting in-person worship starting the first week of July. (And I say this recognizing that this decision may be altered, if the data in the State warrants it.) We are committed to making these experiences as safe as we can make them. We will be unable to eliminate all risk, but we will do our best to reduce risk. You will be the major players in making sure that our gatherings are safe.

- Know that we will trust whatever you decide about return to worship. Some of you may decide not to come back. We will respect your choice. We will continue on-line worship.
- Those of you who have any signs of Covid-19 or other flu-like sicknesses, we ask that you NOT attend.
- As many of our worship experiences as possible will be held outdoors in the back or northern side of the building. If you can, please bring your own chairs. As you gather, please maintain good physical distance, even when we are outside.
- If we are unable to do worship outside, it is likely that we will do it in our Family Life Center.
- Please wear a mask when you come. This is especially important for in-building worship. The
  latest studies are showing that mask-wearing reduces the likelihood of spread by 85%. We
  understand that there are some people for whom mask-wearing is not possible because of
  certain health conditions. But mask-wearing is our expectation.
- It is likely that there will be a lot less singing in worship than we are accustomed to. Evidently, singing is one of the behaviors that when done close to others is a good way for the virus to spread. You will probably hear leaders singing and will experience a lot more instrumental music.
- If you are able, we would like to ask you to bring your own elements for communion—bread and wine or grape juice. Perhaps you can place them in a small picnic basket. We will have bread and wine available for those who do not bring their own elements. These will be provided in a way that will practically be touch free.
- We will ask that you communicate to us your desire to attend worship. You will be able to do that via a telephone call to the office or an on-line platform. Look within this newsletter for more

# From Intern Paula

Just a "couple" thoughts...

Last week, I began moving back into my office at church. For the past couple of months, my living room has been the place where I have attended Zoom meetings, classes and discussions; it's where I've written prayers and papers for class, two sermons and communicated with many of you via social media, phone or written correspondence. So as I began transporting monitors, books and study materials back to church, I came to realize I have processed much of the world from the limited confines of my home. I have been inundated by visual imagery of the death and devastation of a global pandemic, racial tensions, and protests where anger, fear and frustration have fueled violence and brought inequality to the forefront of our conversations. I have witnessed a lot from my quarantined space and I know you have, too.

So I began to think about how we experience human reality simply by being in a specific space and place. How the world looks different to someone depending on what vantage point they see it from and whom they see it with. Our various spaces even sound different, taste different and smell different. I cannot begin to understand what it's like to experience tear gas infiltrating my eyes and lungs or what it's like for a mother to have "the talk" with her children about how to respond to specific situations due to the color of their skin. You see, the reality specific to my space and place cannot fully understand what it's like to be in someone else's space that is different than mine. And sometimes, that place for me, is a dangerous place of misconceptions and judgment. It is also a place that reminds me of the importance of listening and sharing space with each other.

Jesus listened without prejudice. We can especially see this in His interaction with the woman at the well (John. 4:4-42). Despite culture, gender, racial, and moral strikes against her, Jesus lovingly interacted with her as he listened to her story. As some of us are beginning to gather again in the limited spaces and places on our church grounds, we become acutely

aware of the fact that we have experienced different feelings, fears, and perhaps false perceptions in our intentional spaces.

There is a lot going on in the world today and the next several months will be chock full of uncertainty, challenges and change. I am grateful for the faith community at First Lutheran who bears witness to each other's stories. We all come to the table with a different experience, from a different place and from a different space; however, I believe one of the *gifts* we have received as children of God, is a listening heart. Jesus knew the value of listening in fulfilling the mission of the church and in living out God's design for his people - whatever space or place or circumstance they happen to be in at any given time. I am blessed to share *this* space and *this* place with you.

# Gather Together with Us as We Return to In-person Worship!

We joyfully announce our return to in-person worship following Stay-at-Home orders during the COVID-19 pandemic. Our church is moving to Phase II of our Reopening Plans that include in-person worship with limitations. Please note, while in-person worship we be held at **9:30 a.m.**, we will continue providing online worship on Sunday mornings at **10:30 a.m.** on Facebook (<a href="https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCrtDsSp0hCtcuH">www.facebook.com/FELCMuskegon</a>) and on YouTube (<a href="https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCrtDsSp0hCtcuH">https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCrtDsSp0hCtcuH</a> 2Xf97w5g).

We are re-establishing our worship services with limited attendance and following guidelines issued by the State of Michigan and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. We are providing a ticketing system through Eventbrite to attend worship.

For the health and safety of our church family, we ask that you follow these important protocols:

- **BRING:** Please bring your own communion elements (bread and wine or grape juice), chairs when worshipping outside, and masks.
- **ATTENDANCE**: Must have Eventbrite ticket for admission to help us follow social distancing guidelines regarding social gathering group size.
- **PARKING:** Limited parking in the church parking lot or parking is available at the former skating rink located to the north of the church on Whitehall Road.
- **SEATING:** Worshippers will be required to maintain social distancing with seating, except within immediate families. Thursday services will be held in the sanctuary. Saturday and Sunday services will be held in the church parking lot.
- RESTROOMS: Will be available during all worship services.
- RAIN/INCLEMENT WEATHER: In case of rain or inclement weather, worship moves to the Family Life Center.

Please use the following directions to reserve your free tickets to attend worship.

- 1. Go to the church's website at <a href="https://www.firstlutheranmuskegon.com">www.firstlutheranmuskegon.com</a>.
- 2. Select the Worship Service you wish to attend & click the date to begin. (**Note:** each Worship Service has a separate link.)
- 3. Note the date of the worship displayed in the upper right of the page to ensure you are registering for the desired service. Click the green "REGISTER" button along the right side of the screen to begin.
- **4.** Select the number of tickets you wish to order. You may order up to 10 tickets. If you need more, please make additional orders. When finished, click the orange "REGISTER" button at the bottom of the page.
- **4.** Add your name and email address to the order on the Check Out page. Again, click the orange "REGISTER" button at the bottom to proceed.
- 5. Your ticket order will be sent to your email address. You may either PRINT your tickets a PDF file with your tickets will be attached to the email, OR you may download the Eventbrite App and add the tickets to your phone.
- 6. Bring your printed ticket(s) or show your ticket via the Eventbrite App to the ushers when you arrive at Worship.

### 2017 Miracle Event Fundraiser

On June 10 and 11, 2017, we held the Miracle Event fundraiser *Building our Tomorrows, Today*. Led by the Stewardship Ministry, the goal of the event was to raise enough money through pledges and donations to purchase a new church boiler and to eliminate as much of the mortgage debt as possible.

The final pledges have been fulfilled, and we are pleased to announce that the total amount raised was \$97,987.00! From those donations, \$60,390 was paid for the new boiler system and \$37,597 has been applied to the principal of our mortgage loan.

What an amazing show of support from all of who contributed. A huge thank you to those who worked on the event! Thank you so much for sustaining the life and ministry of First Lutheran!
