Covid 19 has been casting its ugly shadow on the world and, in our case, on the church for more than two years. We are not finished with this awful virus, but if the experts are right, we may be through the worst of the pandemic. Covid case numbers are now dropping precipitously. And those vaccinated persons who are getting the virus generally are not getting horribly sick. Covid, those who are most knowledgeable are telling us, may become an experience of that like the seasonal flu or a cold.

I am certainly not declaring the virus a done deal, but I do think it is time for us to start thinking of what it might be like to live not controlled by this pandemic. There are some of you who have not joined us in-person for worship or study for almost two years. I know that some of you may never return, but I would urge others of you who are thinking about returning to in-person reality to do so.

While we were on vacation, Bev and I watched our service online, being grateful for that opportunity but realizing that it was nothing like being with folks in person. Some of you, because of health concerns, may never get to be with us again. I understand that and am grateful that you can maintain a connection through our online worship and studies. Those things will never go away. But for those of you who can be here, I would urge you to begin to make your way back here. It's time. We miss you. Your pastor and pastoral assistant (Paula) miss you.

Our congregation has remained surprisingly strong during the pandemic. In fact, we have been remarkably creative and have welcomed many new people. Just think what fun you, if you have been away from our gatherings, will have as you encounter new folks and explore new possibilities for serving.

From Pastoral Assistant Paula

It is February 15th. Snow banks line the roadways, temperatures are still below the freezing mark on a consistent basis and I am hoping for a few more snowshoe adventures. However. I smell spring in the air. I smell new life emerging in the middle of February - even as snow clouds are hanging on the horizon. I smell spring.

The rhythm of seasonal change reminds me of the liturgical pattern of worship. There is a sense of order created by liturgy and when our lives are in disarray, or dis-ordered, the patterns of liturgy, sometimes without even knowing it, bring us to a place of newness. In the book, *liturgy of the ordinary*, author Tish Warren claims (and I would agree with her) that our worship together as a church forms us in a particular way and shapes us into people who value that which gives life and transforms us; value to that which transforms us day by day, by the rhythms of repentance and faith. We need to learn the slow habits of loving God and those around us.

Warren goes on to say that the kind of spiritual life and disciplines needed to sustain us in Christian life are quiet, repetitive, and ordinary. It's life embodied in the daily routines we live into day in and day out. So as we begin our journey through Lent and walk through our ordinary day, it may be helpful to look at our daily practices as liturgies and examine how they shape us. Our everyday habits and daily practices are interwoven with and transformed by our communal liturgies each Sunday.

"Examining our daily life through the lens of liturgy allows us to see who these habits are shaping us to be, and the ways we can live as people who have been loved and transformed by God." ~Tish Warren


