From Pastor Bill

We have just finished proclaiming "Christ is risen; he is risen indeed." It's the fundamental message of the Christian life. Life, not death, reigns.

Trusting that in the midst of an evil war brought on by an evil man, in the midst of a pandemic that just won't let go, in the midst of yet more gun violence, is hard work. Sometimes it seems that death is the primary data on the ground.

Truthfully, death is very real. It is not something we can dismiss with some nice cliches or with positive thinking. Honestly, it takes a toll on us. I know it has taken a toll on me.

But still, we Christians are convinced, hidden in the data of death is life—life waiting to burst forth and life bursting forth on so many occasions.

To trust the resurrection is frankly to live differently. A picture in my office proclaims a "confidence to sing that death has lost its venomed sting." Trusting life in the midst of death means living in a way that does not give the final power to death.

For me, that looks like

- nurturing relationships and building community
- resisting the temptation to stay away from being with people
- visiting the sick and holding the hands of the dying
- working to reduce our carbon footprint (look for news in the future about a solar project for our church building)
- · cleaning up the beach, recycling
- feeding the hungry, housing the poor
- helping to settle refugees
- making music and listening to it
- getting up off the couch and moving
- struggling with our tendency to be defensive and move toward anxiety and fear
- crossing boundaries and meeting new people and cultures and eating unfamiliar food

To live trusting life means opening ourselves up to what life can bring us and to what the world has to offer us. To trust death is to close ourselves off and down.

But "Christ is risen; he is risen, indeed." Why would we want to live as if he is not?

Everyone Gets to Play. This is a chapter heading from the book, OUT OF SORTS, by author Sarah Bessey. The author is referencing a statement made by John Wimber, founder of the Vineyard movement of churches. While I do not subscribe to the mission of this movement, I do however, think Wimber makes a relevant point when it comes to the role of the church. He states, "When it comes to the kingdom of God, everyone gets to play." I believe this statement rings true now, more than ever before, as the church emerges from the pandemic. I feel as if we are waking from a comatose state and have the opportunity to envision something new in the body of the church.

While we gathered on Easter this year, I looked out over the vast - now a relative term for me considering worship with empty pews was a norm for a bit - array of faces and saw a new, blended family emerging. I realize that some of the assembly were out-of-town visitors but nonetheless, there was a common purpose among the new faces: we are all sorting out life. Perhaps seeking a deeper understanding of what it means to follow Jesus. Perhaps picking up the pieces of a life that has gone awry. Perhaps wondering if our limited understanding of God may be accompanied by more questions than answers.

Bessey states that sorting out the pieces of our lives and wondering what to throw out, what to keep and what to repurpose can be a daunting task. In fact, if we are honest, shifting and sorting and seeking through our faith can be terrifying. We might lose something valuable to us: our certainty, our comfort, our view of ourself. But we live out our life in a constant flow of change. We live out of our imperfect answers. We want to do things right as we move forward in the church, in our lives and into the bigger story of Jesus. We want all our ducks in a row, our answers indexed in three-ring binders. But instead, this is faith at its core (Bessey p.54).

We're not always ready for change either. At least I'm not. In fact, I often balk at it; however, the pandemic has provided space for us, both individually and as the body of Christ, to sort "stuff" out and do something new. We don't always have the answers to our questions and sometimes the process takes a few steps forward and then a few back. But the good news, the good news is that everyone gets to play. Resurrection you see, shows up in odd places and grace waits for us in the in-between spaces accompanied by change. So come, question with me and be open to something new!

"The American Red Cross has a constant and ongoing need for blood and platelet donations. As hospitals resume surgical procedures and patient treatments that were temporarily paused due to the COVID-19 pandemic, donors are urged to give now to ensure blood products are readily available for patients."

One can donate blood if they have had Covid and have fully recovered AND if they have had an approved Covid vaccination. When donating, they must know which vaccination they received, i.e. Phizer, Moderna, Johnson & Johnson, etc.
